Exam Information

FCE is an upper intermediate level exam, at level B2 of the Council of Europe's Common European Framework of Reference for Languages.

FCE is ideal if you want to work or study abroad because it is internationally recognised. It can help to develop a career which requires language skills (e.g. business, medicine, engineering). A pass at FCE shows that you have mastered most of the grammar of English and can use it well.

FCE has five sections:

- Reading
- Writing
- Use of English
- Listening
- Speaking

The exam takes place twice a year, in June and December, depending on your local centre. The Speaking section takes place on a different day to the Reading, Writing and English in Use sections.

CAE is the second highest level Cambridge ESOL exam, at level C1 of the Council of Europe's Common European Framework of Reference for Languages. You should consider taking CAE if you are reaching a standard of English that is adequate for most purposes, including social and professional situations, and in higher education.

Passing CAE proves you have the ability to communicate with confidence in English and

deal with most aspects of everyday life. It is probably the most popular Cambridge exam today.

Studying for CAE will help you to improve your language skills and use them in a very wide range of situations. The exams are based on realistic tasks, and test the ability to use the English language in practical contexts. If you are successful, you will be able to take an active part in meetings and discussions, express your opinions clearly, and be able to understand and produce texts of various types, including business letters and reports. You'll also be more than capable of following university courses taught in English.
